

Dear Friends,

I write this after taking some time off and then attending of our synod's Fall Theological Conference. I found it refreshing and invigorating all at the same time! Upon reflection, I realize that many of you have reminded me way to often to be sure to take some time for rest. It's unfortunate that we have to be reminded of this. But it is so important to remember.



Currently, the confirmation students are learning all about the Ten Commandments and why they are important for all God's people. We discussed how the commandments were given out of love to help us thrive. They learned that the first three commandments have to do with our relationship with God - while the final seven relate to how we live in community with each other. The third command to "Remember the sabbath day"... is not God's way of just saying 'Take the day off!' but rather, "This is how you live fully and in relationship with me." As Kara Root put it: "We are invited to come back to our place belonging," And to do that, we need to bracket out that space.

Speakers Kara and Andrew Root helped my colleagues and I reconnect with that sense of belonging to God, to each other and also to ourselves. Andrew shared his wisdom about the times we live in. He said that in our culture we confuse busyness with fullness. And out of that sense of being, our society continues to speed up. We fill our time - often finding worth in that. And that "leads to the disintegration and erosion of commitment" - to God and to each other. Andrew shared that "our churches may be too fatigued to be church" because "people feel that change means performing more and getting others to do the same.

Now I'm not suggesting that we stop working in ministry as church together. Instead, I believe that in this special time of change for our churches that God is calling us to remember who and whose we are. And all too often, we keep ourselves busy in ways that prevent us from remembering that. So as we move together in this most exciting time, let us remember sabbath not only as a day, but as a state of being. And then, maybe we can truly "keep it Holy."





All women who participate in any of our activities are invited to join us at our November 14th meeting. We will meet in Fellowship Hall after worship. Please wear masks.

Stephen Ministry has trained Caregivers available to meet with you. If you would like to discuss this further or need care, please contact Pastor Connie at the church or Linda Tedlie @ 920-410-0745 . The story below shows how Stephen Ministry can help you to.

"Fourteen months ago, I was at a point where I needed someone to talk to about the struggles in my life. My pastor recommended I consider meeting with a Stephen Minister - another man, trained as a caregiver, who would walk with me during this difficult time. Trusting someone with personal information about my life was something I feared at first, but my pastor reassured me that everything was confidential, so I agreed to give it a try. I'm so glad I did! Soon after meeting my Stephen Minister, I quickly sensed I could trust him. Part of that trust came from knowing he was trained to help people through their problems. He made me feel comfortable by not prying for information, but instead just letting me share what was on my mind. Any questions he did ask fit our conversation appropriately. Probably the best thing he did for me was not judging me for my past decisions; rather, he was there to help me move forward. I think another significant trust-building factor was being able to talk with someone who was not in my regular circle of friends. My friends certainly continued to have a very important place in my life, but I also needed someone who could see me objectively. That helped make it easier to share personal parts of my life. Also, knowing my Stephen Minister would be there for me "next week" (we usually met for an hour each week) gave me confidence.

I see now how much I needed regular encouragement as I rode the roller coaster of emotions that came during this period of instability in my life. I really appreciated our times together. Our weekly visits were more than just meeting to talk. They also helped keep me accountable between times, to carry through with the changes I said I wanted to make. My Stephen Minister often went out of his way to help me in my struggle. My life experience during the 10 months I met with my Stephen Minister was not always one of progress. It took courage for me to honestly share when I had my failures and setbacks too. Even then my Stephen Minister was there for me. He encouraged me not to give up, but to pick up and keep going forward. That genuine acceptance spoke to me the most; not to accept failure, but to confess, turn, and receive forgiveness. Having someone assure me of that biblical truth was really encouraging and was exactly what I needed. My Stephen Minister walked with me through a really dark part of my life, pointing me to the truth and love that is in Christ. I thank the Lord for my Stephen Minister who did not try to solve all my problems but lovingly, as a Christian brother, walked along with me through this valley in my life.

If you are dealing with some type of crisis or difficulty in life, I encourage you to meet with a Stephen Minister. You won't regret it! "

OPPORUNITIES TO SERVE

Our Church family has the opportunity to serve the community by taking a meal to 30-35 clients and staff at the Day by Day warming shelter in the basement of St Peters school on High Ave. This group has been serving the Oshkosh homeless for 11 years at this location and has held fundraisers to build a new shelter which would be open year round rather than October 15th to April 15th. They also hold some events in the summer where guests can check in, take a shower, do laundry, come to job fairs and get help with motel vouchers and other ways to assist guests.

Susan Smith has secured 3 dates for this year- the first being October 28th, the second In mid February on a Wednesday, so the confirmation students can share that experience and the last being March 18th. The ladies have chosen a BBQ meal for the coming Thursday and there is a sign up sheet which started on the 17th and will be out at church during the week and again on the 24th. If there is a cancellation from a different group, we maybe called, but is more unlikely than likely to happen.

There is an orientation offered, but Sue and I have taken it and several others have worked on this before; they will tell you it is worth the experience. Other ways to help at other tasks needed is, an AM shift where you assemble breakfast bags, take food inventory, do breakfast dishes and complete other tasks as needed.

As Pastor's sermon, this is a way to do Gods work and it is moving to have a guest come and tell you how good the meal was and to come again. You wont regret this experience! If you want to be involved contact the church or myself. Thank you!
